

Spartans Wallop CPS 28-0

The San Jose Spartans, in their first invasion of the Puget Sound area, scored four times in the second half to defeat the Loggers by the score of 28 to 0, in a thrilling game played at the Tacoma Stadium last Saturday.

The score in itself does not give a true picture of the game. The Loggers held the powerful San Jose team, rated last year number 57 in the nation, scoreless the entire first half. As the followers of the Loggers will agree, the CPS eleven looked better than on any other occasion this season. They tackled harder, ran harder, and with the good kicking shown by Warren Woods, the Loggers should be in fine shape to meet Whitman Saturday.

The Logger line stopped the strong Spartan attack all first half and in the second quarter they stopped San Jose cold on the one yard line.
