


Old Knute, not to be outdone, immediately led the student body in a Logger locomotive (spelling logger L-o-u-r.)



"Regularly enrolled students of CPS are expected not to enroll for correspondence work in other colleges and universities", said the registrar. "Such exceptions as necessary should have their corespondence work OK'd by their adviser and the registrar's office at the regular registration period."

This, he said, would apply to such cases as a graduating senior who wished to take some course offered in alternate years which was not available the year he was graduating. He also cautioned that if the work entails any overload, the dean's approval is necessary. All correspon- wedding. dence work must be properly cleared with the school before the school will agree to accept it towards graduation.

When a student enrolls at CPS, any correspondence work he has taken before is evaluated in the same manner as transfer credits.
